From Pastor's Desk

***Now greet the swiftly changing year With joy and penitence sincere.
Rejoice! Rejoice! With thanks embrace Another year of grace.***

***With Him as Lord to lead our way In want and in prosperity,
What need we fear in earth or space In this new year of grace! LSB #896 st.1, 5***

Anno Domini, the year of our Lord, 2022 AD. It's hard to believe that 2022 is just around the corner. I remember when 1981 (the year I graduated from the seminary and received my first pastoral call) seemed to be so very far in the future. Now, 1981 is so very distant in the past! Ancient history even.... How the years have flown by!

A lot has happened over the intervening years, in my life and in the life of Holy Cross Lutheran Church. A lot has happened in the past two years, and now we look at the beginning of 2022.

For myself, it has been an eventful and different past year in many ways. Almost two years ago, because of Covid-19, ministry planning was put on hold by many vacant congregations. Because of that, there were no churches available for me to serve in the Nebraska District as an Intentional Interim Pastor (IIP). (I had served four in a row in NE from July, 2015–August, 2020.) Sue and I pondered if I should retire, but we felt that God still had much for me to do as an IIP. My NE District President (DP) shared my name with other DP's of our LCMS, and the next morning I heard from your DP, Dr. Allan Buss. In late October of 2020, I started work as your Interim Pastor.

We have faced many challenges, prayed many prayers, been fed and nurtured together in God's Word and Sacraments, have said many 'Auf Wiedersehens' and have continually contemplated God's will and purpose for us in this time and place. I have enjoyed the cottage group meetings, the conversations, the visits, the counseling and prayers. There are so many great people active here at Holy Cross, and so many great people who are on the fringes here at Holy Cross, watching, waiting and contemplating....

Many have told me, "I'm sitting back and watching to see what happens..." I understand that feeling, but again I tell you, "What happens when you sit back and wait???? – nothing, at least nothing good!" I again encourage all to prayerfully consider what God has gifted and is calling you to do. In a summary of a devotion I recently read, I share with you: "Be praying; be giving; and be attending!" Step up and help make things happen that you would like to see happen..... AND SEE WHAT HAPPENS, as we trust in the Lord and act on that trust!!!! Whatever you do, do with joy and thanksgiving to God!

We have talked a lot about how we are to love and forgive one another, build up one another, encourage one another, and care for one another. We show this in how we listen to each other and how we in love confront one another when we step out of line in something we do or say..... I know, some have had the habit of not saying or doing anything, because they didn't want to hurt someone's feelings..... But I have observed that this only allows frustrations and hurts to build up, and hurtful behavior to continue. Instead, always be loving, always be caring, but always be willing to say or do what needs to be said or done. And trust one another that what is being done or said is being done in love and compassion for the Lord, for each other and for our Lord and the ministry that He has given us to do together!

I have been with you here at Holy Cross for this entire calendar year of 2021, I have been able to support my family with an entire year's salary, it's not often I can say that – it's the nature of my calling, to have 'gaps in

pay' between churches. I thank you for the love and support shown by so many to me and also, my wife Sue, and your care and compassion has been noticed and greatly appreciated by us both.

In every good development and blessing, to God be the glory! Amid every trial, trouble and challenge, God has been and will continue to be with us to sustain us in His power and grace! What a joy to see and know that God continues to do great things among, within, and through His people of faith who gather around and share His Word and Sacraments.

My intent has always been that I would see you through the Interim Process, the calling process, AND be with you until we know the identity of our next resident pastor who has accepted our call. We don't yet know the identity of our next pastor, but we keep praying about this (and for him and his family), that God's will be done and that it would be done in HIS time! We plan to extend a second call, Sunday, January 9 at 9:45 AM in the church sanctuary.

My permanent call to this temporary situation of being your pastor as we go through this transition process was for 12 (up to 18) months. In October, we affirmed the 18 months extension. If we don't have our next pastor before then, my plan has always been to then be with you through the entire 18 months, which would take me through April of 2022. My last Sunday with you would then be May 1, 2022.

As I shared with the congregation this last weekend, I have received a call to serve at a different church as an IIP. Of course, I also still have the call that I presently serve with you!

I now share what I shared last Sunday (December 18 & 19):

(words read from the bulletin) **Pastor Meyer has received a call to serve as the Intentional Interim Pastor (IIP) at Eternal Savior Lutheran Church in Lafayette, Colorado. (located between Denver and Boulder) Their current pastor of 26 years is retiring at the end of this month. Pastor Meyer appreciates your prayers and comments as he prayerfully considers God's will for him at this time.**

(words I then added) **My intent has always been that I would serve as your IIP until we knew who our next Resident Pastor would be – or through April with my last Sunday being no later than May 1, 2022. With this extended call from Colorado, I am being asked to reconsider God's will for me and my plans at this time.**

Please know that in the future, in the shortage of pastors that we presently have in synod, you will have a good pastor who will receive calls to serve elsewhere. We do ask that pastors prayerfully consider the calls extended to them AND it is very important that you, the members of Holy Cross, let your pastor know your thoughts about their calls and what you feel about their work among and with you and why you think they should stay here.

But please know and remember this!!!!, and this is very important: "Until a pastor tells you that he has accepted a call to go and serve elsewhere in God's kingdom, NOTHING HAS CHANGED! he work and ministry that you share together as pastor and congregation continues!!!"

I hope the above is helpful. Again, please know that as far as I am concerned, you are 'stuck' with me until we know who are next pastor is, or until May 1. However, I don't get to control all the details of my calendar and as we all are reminded for this time of year, and always, from Psalm 31:14-15, **"I trust in You, O Lord; I say, "You are my God." My times are in Your hands...."**

What a privilege and honor it is to be your pastor during this time of transition. By God's grace a lot of good things have happened and are continuing to happen. To God be the glory! But as we see the hurts and fears of many around us, as we hear of all the growing loneliness and depression in our neighborhoods and cities, we know there is much more to still do. There are literally so many ministry opportunities being laid at our doorstep, opportunities that Holy Cross is in the PERFECT location to address. So, we strive to move forward, building upon the blessings of the past and thankful for the privilege of continued and growing service to the glory of God and for the good of our neighbors.

Many good ideas are being shared, considered and may yet be acted upon. May we, in all things, continue to ask, "Lord, what would YOU have us do?" And trusting the Lord and His Word, let us continue to move forward in caring ministry and follow where He leads us.

Yes, how quickly the years go by. How quickly things change. How different things look,yet, at the same time, how remarkably, things stay the same. Though our world is changing rapidly, God's love and grace is still constant and dependable for us with all His people of faith. And His love, forgiveness and eternal promises, centered in Jesus, continue to offer and supply what is the most urgent need of all humankind.

Rejoice! Rejoice! With thanks embrace another year of grace..... IN JESUS!
