#### FROM PASTORS DESK

" Easter Sermon "

The sermon that I preached this Easter Sunday has elicited different reactions; some very happy with it, others not so much. I wanted to take time in this month's article to explain more about why I preached what I preached. If you have questions or disagreements, please come talk with me as I desire to faithfully serve this congregation.

As you all know, pretty much every church deals with the trouble of a chunk of the membership only attending church on Christmas and Easter. Many have even given them nicknames such as "Chreasters" or "CEO (Christmas/Easter Only) Christians". This, of course, is not what any of us want to see. We want to have the joy of them attending regularly with us. We hear of that joy of Christian fellowship in Acts 2, "And all who believed were together and had all things in common…and day by day, attending the temple together and breaking bread in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts…" We also hear in Scripture that the Church is the body of Christ, as St. Paul writes in Romans 12 and 1 Corinthians 12. The body is not to be separate but joined together in joy and fellowship.

The difficulty in this is that many of these people are accustomed to only worshipping twice a year and see that as being perfectly normal and okay. However, this is not what Scripture says. We see this in Hebrews 10, "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some..." We don't want their practice of worshiping only twice a year to continue, for their good and for the good of the Church. Some think that if we just share the Gospel and are nice, then they will eventually break their bad habit of skipping church. However, in Scripture, when we see people not acting according to God's Law, it's usually the proclamation of the Law from the Prophets, the Apostles, and even Jesus Himself that calls them out of that behavior.

C.F.W. Walther, the first president of the LCMS, wrote this thesis (Thesis 8) in the book, *The Proper Distinction Between Law and Gospel*,

"In the fourth place, the Word of God is not rightly divided when the Law is preached to those who are already in terror on account of their sins or the Gospel to those who live securely in their sins."

To summarize his lectures, he says that those who are sorry for their sins shouldn't be given the Law, but the comfort of the Gospel and, likewise, those who are fine with sinful behavior shouldn't be given the Gospel, but the sternness of the Law. This is done to bring them to repentance, that their lives might change and shift to be in accordance with Scripture.

This is what I tried to do with my Easter sermon. To the faithful, I preached about the joy that the Resurrection of our Lord brings. To those who I hadn't seen since Christmas or last Easter, I preached that this

is not pleasing to the Lord and His Church and that they should change their ways and join in worship regularly with the body of Christ. I tied this with the women initially fleeing the tomb in fear and inaction after hearing the wonderful news that Jesus is alive. All of this was preached that those who are stuck in the habit of not attending church would be convicted, repent, and join us in fellowship and joy.

This was probably the most uncomfortable I've ever been when preaching a sermon; it was not a fun sermon to preach. However, seeing people year after year set aside only two hours for Jesus and His Church and being told that is fine, I felt led in my vocation as Pastor to preach the Law to those who are secure in this behavior. I pray that the Holy Spirit, who alone creates and nourishes faith, will work through those words to bring more people to the comfort of His gifts given in church.

Again, if you have questions or thoughts for me, please share them with me. I ask that you please put the best construction on me, "since love covers a multitude of sins." I only desire to be faithful in my calling and proclamation of the Word of God, that people would hear and believe, entering eternal salvation with all the saints. Please pray that those who heard this Easter message would take it to heart and that the Holy Spirit would bring them into this fellowship.
