FROM PASTOR'S DESK

"The Prayer of the Church"

Growing up, I understood the point of most parts of the liturgy. Confession and Absolution was very clear to me; I am a sinner and need forgiveness. The Scripture readings and sermon were also clear; the Word needed to be read and proclaimed to the people. But one part that I never really valued was the Prayer of the Church. This is that prayer the pastor prays right after the sermon. It seemed so long and pointless to me and my older brother that we once, rather irreverently, timed our dad's prayer to see how ridiculously long it was. Since those days of my youth, I have come to a much greater appreciation for the Prayer of the Church and here are some of the reasons why. First, this is a prayer to our heavenly Father. To be able to do this is a gift in and of itself, as Luther explains in the Lord's Prayer, "With these words (Our Father who art in heaven) God tenderly invites us to believe that He is our true Father and that we are His true children, so that with all boldness and confidence we may ask Him as dear children ask their dear Father." God desires to hear the voice of His people and that is exactly what happens in the Prayer of the Church. We come before God and pray to our Father, knowing that He will hear us and answer us. Second, notice whose prayer this is. It's not called the Prayer of the Pastor, but the Prayer of the Church. Yes, the pastor does most of the actual speaking, but he is simply the spokesman for the whole congregation. This is why the pastor uses the "we/us" pronouns during the prayer and the congregation speaks "amen" at the end, as well as answering each petition with, "hear our prayer". This prayer is to be prayed in the hearts of all the congregation. The devil likes to distract us away from praying, for he hates all things that are good for the Christian. Jesus teaches us to pray that we may resist the devil and grow closer to our Father.

Third, when I say it's the Church's prayer, it's not just the prayer concerning the congregation of Holy Cross Lutheran Church, but all of Christianity around the world, the universal Church. This is why there are so many different petitions listed, some of which may not always apply directly to us. We pray for all pastors, for new congregations, for our nation, for people working, for schools, for seedtime and harvest, for parents and their children, for the arts and culture of our people, and for all people going through hardship. While the people of Holy Cross may not fall into all of these categories every Sunday, there is at least one Christian somewhere in the world that does, and so we pray for them. I had always thought the prayer was too long, but in reality, we should probably be extending our Prayer of the Church even more to pray for more people.

St. Paul says in 1 Thessalonians 5:17 to "pray without ceasing". In the Prayer of the Church, we take a few short minutes to pray to our Father with praises to Him and petitions for the needs of His Church. The Prayer of the Church is a beautiful example of loving God and loving our neighbor. We praise God for what He has done and continues to do, and we pray for our neighbor, that God would provide for them. So next time you are in church, and we begin the Prayer of the Church, think of the wonderful blessing it is to spend time praying to your heavenly Father and to have the opportunity to pray for other people around the world.

******UPDATE ON STAINED GLASS WINDOWS*****

WE ARE ALMOST THERE!!! Our Stained-Glass Window Project started in August of 2021 with the signing of a contract with Cathedral Craft and with restoration beginning in May 2022. All the work has been completed and now we must finish with the funding. The cost of this project was \$152,549. We have received from your generous donations of about \$142,000 leaving a balance of about \$10,500. Your support for the project has been much appreciated but we need to finish our journey. REPORT FROM THE LWML CONVENTION "Celebrating the Lord of the nations"

The 80th Biennial Convention of Lutheran Women in Mission (LWML) just concluded in Milwaukee, Wi.

3,649 women and men attended the 4 day event of this organization, one of the two auxiliary organizations of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. There was an inspirational opening service with 80 Pastors in the opening procession. The 343 choir members added special anthems. With the assistance of 60 LWML members, Holy Communion was celebrated for everyone in attendance. The Northern Wisconsin District President, Rev. Dwayne Lueck, proclaimed the message to the gathering.

The business meetings on the following two days featured many speakers from LWML programs that benefit from LWML funding. Thirty-one organizations in fellowship with the LCMS that applied for grant funding were selected and new officers were elected for the next two years.

The grants total \$2,350,000. The funds that were dispersed are the MITES that Lutherans all over this country collect and donate. Your MITE donations are part of this. There was a golf outing on the day the convention opened that raised over \$35,000! A walk along Milwaukee's scenic Riverwalk on Saturday afternoon raised more than \$112,000. Of that amount, \$250 was from Holy Cross members who supported my participation in the walk. These funds will be part of the grant funding to be dispersed at the next convention in two years in Omaha, Nebraska.

Gifts from the Heart in the form of Disaster Kits and knit hats for cancer patients that were gathered by the Prayer Shawl Ministry team were part of the overwhelming amount of donations that were collected. Many servant events benefitted other organizations, including 79 pints of donated blood.

Synod's President, Rev. Dr. Matthew Harrison was a featured speaker and hosted a reception in remembrance of the lives lost to abortion.

It was a wonderful convention and well worth the trip to Milwaukee. It was worthwhile to be a worker for Northern Illinois District, one of the co-hosts of the event. We are looking forward to the next convention in 2025 in Omaha.


