From Pastor's Desk

Do not be afraid!

Is much easier to say than to do. I look around and I see a lot of fear in our world, and sometimes, if I am honest, I see it also when I look into the mirror. Yet God tells us and all His people of faith, whatever our struggles or burdens, "Do not be afraid, I am your God, I am with you and will help you."

Are you weary and heavy-burdened?

I see a lot of that wherever I look. Sometimes, if I am honest, I see it also when I look into the mirror. Yet God tells us and all His people of faith, "Come to Me and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you.... And you will find rest for your souls."

Let us continue to go to Jesus. Let us accept the tasks and purpose that He has prepared for us and given to us. Let us walk, step in step with Jesus, yoked with Jesus, stepping forward in the ministry, the love, the care, the difference making service that God invites us to be part of as we live our lives as God's people, forgiven and redeemed in Jesus!

How does this all look? Here are some devotional thoughts gleaned from various sources in my devotions and readings this past week:

1. Pray daily
2. Set aside the nostalgia and longing for the way things were years ago. This might seem to be an odd thing to commend, but God is calling us forward. In other words, let us not unwittingly discourage others by always sounding like we long for 'the days of old'. Learn lessons from the past, be encouraged, become wiser, but know that God's plan and purpose for us is ahead of us.
3. Look forward, don't always be looking back! Encourage one another. This ties in with #3. People quit coming to church, etc., because 'it's not like it used to be'. 'I miss the pastor', 'I miss the people',.... "I miss not having to wear a mask!!!" But we worship the Lord. Wherever God's Word is read, wherever God's Holy Sacraments are rightly administered, God is present. Let us come and worship the Lord. Let us break through the barriers, distractions and temptations that would keep us away from God's Word. Let us join the Psalmist when he says, ***'I rejoiced with those who said to me, Let us go to the house of the LORD.'*** Ps 122:1
4. Surrender totally and completely to the Lord! Be totally and completely dedicated and committed to the Lord!

Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. ² Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will." Romans 12:1-2

Yes, we are facing some head winds and things that could easily discourage us, if we let them. But the Lord assures us that He is with us and will NOT forsake us. Let us NOT forsake Him! Let us trust the Lord, in ALL things, and following Him and going where He leads us, let us continue to discover, together, what God has in mind for Holy Cross Lutheran as we go forward in His grace and blessing!

And, in difficult times and in all times, let us be wise, and show and reflect love, care, compassion and kindness to one another and to all, for we are the people of God! We will not be afraid!

Keep the faith! Keep leaning on Jesus!

1. **MASKS – I am disappointed that this issue has been thrust upon us once again – whatever our varied opinions may be, it is what it is..... whereas:**
 - a. We recognize that our State Governor has again mandated that masks be worn by all people indoors.
 - b. Our District President tells us that he believes “it would seem wise to comply with this mask mandate”. (see enclosed portions of a letter from our District President)
 - c. **therefore:** We strongly encourage all members and guests to wear a mask while indoors. Out of love and concern for the weaker among us and in respect of those who are in authority over us, we will be wise and respectful to all in our words and actions!
2. **The Church Picnic on August 29 was such a joyful experience.** The shade under the trees on the east side of the church was the perfect place. We had over 100 people who attended! Great conversations, fellowship, food... The Petting Zoo was a hit. Several families from the area attended and the kids LOVED the animals. To all involved in making this happen, WELL DONE! Thank you!
3. Finance Committee is at work striving to make certain that our financial blessings/savings are a blessing and not a hindrance to the faithful stewardship and ministry work that God has in mind for us going forward. We want to make certain that we are using all our resources to do all the work of ministry that God is calling us to do. We do not want to be guilty of ‘burying’ our talents! In all things, we want to be acting wisely, but without fear, trusting the Lord and one another! Watch for updates in next couple of months as we hear their recommendations!
4. **MAC** Ministry Action Council is at work, meeting each month. This group is helping us coordinate and put into action ministry ideas that address ministry needs among and around us.

Letter from District President: Dr. Allan Buss

(selected portions)

Dear Partners in the Gospel and the Lord's Church,

"What's next?" Many of us have found ourselves asking that question in many circumstances, including recent COVID challenges.

But before we despair, disengage, become bitter or lose heart, we are reminded, "He (Christ) is before all things, and by him all things hold together." (Colossians 1:17) We are being held together, and you and I are being held in the blood stained hands of Jesus. We rejoice in His eternal promises. No wonder we are hope-filled and grateful. I sincerely thank you for all the time, effort and wrestling over the last year and now again. Your labor is not in vain. (1 Corinthians 15:58)

In a phone call with a lay leader last evening, we discussed recent mandates and how congregations and schools deal with these new challenges. We seem always to be asking, "Now what?" In these discussions the Lord will provide grace, strength and wisdom especially "peace through his blood, shed on the cross." (Colossians 1:20) While not always obvious, we ask **"What is in the best interest of the congregation and those who gather?"** Never far away is, **"How does this decision effect not only my personal perspective but also my neighbor whom I love in Christ?"** As hard as it can be, there are times we need to set aside our personal opinions for the sake of others. We do not set aside the Word of God!

Governor Pritzker mandated, effective August 30, 2021, that face masks will be mandatory, regardless of one's vaccine status, in all public indoor spaces throughout the state. We have been in direct contact with the Illinois Department of Public Health and have been informed that the mandate does include houses of worship. In all our conversations with the Alliance for Defending Freedom, we have heard that it is their understanding that there is not a religious liberty issue when dealing with mask wearing in public worship or in our Lutheran Schools.

Wearing masks does not limit our opportunity to assemble to hear God's Word and receive His sacraments. It does not prevent us from carrying out the godly task of teaching children in our schools. Out of consideration and respect for the government as well as for the vulnerable among us, it would seem wise to comply with this mask mandate.

We encourage engagement with our federal, state and local leaders as part of our calling as Christians who are citizens. We have many ways to express concerns as well as care for our country and community. We are regularly praying for good government.

Included in the Governor's orders is a mandate that school workers either be vaccinated or submit to a weekly COVID test to show they are not carrying the virus. As always, we would urge, in Christian love and care for our neighbor, that each of us would respect the health decisions of each person, as they determine whether they will be vaccinated or undergo weekly screenings.

Call Committee Update

Dear Members and Friends of Holy Cross:

It is with sincere honor and humility that we have been chosen to represent all of our members by serving on the Pastoral Call Committee for Holy Cross. We do realize the importance of our work and promise to faithfully uphold our duties. There are a couple things we would like to share with you as we proceed.

WE NEED YOUR HELP! The best way for you to help is with prayer. We are asking you to pray for three things regarding the Call process.

1. Please pray for our committee. Pray that we consider the needs of our congregation as well as the needs of our community. Pray that we closely examine our hearts and seek the best candidate for this Call, free of any individual agenda, looking out for the best interest of the congregation, and seek the will of God.
2. Please pray for both our next resident Pastor and our current Pastor. God already knows who our next resident Pastor is. Pray that He opens his heart and mind, and leads him to us. Also, keep our present Pastor in your prayers as he guides us through this process.
3. Please pray for our congregation. Pray that we all realize this is not our Call, but God's Call. Help us put past differences behind us and let us all work together for the good of the congregation, putting our own pride and desires aside.

Please pray often for these three things. We believe if we wrap this entire process in prayer, God will send us the right man. Remember it is not our Call but His.

We have already done several things to start the process. The Interim Task Force has put together a very thorough profile of our congregation. They shared this at a congregational meeting and with the District President. The District President has reviewed this document, met with members of the committee as well as some Elders, the Governing Board and members of the congregation. With all of the information he has gathered, he feels comfortable in starting the process of gathering some names of possible candidates.

We are also collecting names of candidates from our members. A pastor nomination form is included at the end of this newsletter or a form can be picked up from the church office. **The deadline for submitting a name is Monday, September 13.** All forms must be turned into the church office so they can be passed on to the call committee for submission to the district office.

We have a very ambitious time line in mind. However we want to make sure we don't rush things too quickly. We would like to extend our first Call sometime before Christmas. With hard work and a lot of prayer, we feel this is a realistic goal. We plan to keep the congregation updated throughout the process with updates in the weekly bulletin and monthly newsletter, and periodic announcements in the church services.

If you would like more information, please contact the church office or one of the committee members. Once again, please keep the congregation, our future Pastor and our Call Committee in your prayers.

We know it's going to be an exciting and educational year for the kids! With Jesus at the center, the kids connect to God and each other through a variety of fun activities. They craft. They play. They even eat creative snacks. All in a way that reinforces God like nothing else. Please join us ages 3 through 6th grade every Sunday! Stained Glass Window Update

Thank you to all the members who attended the voters' meeting on Sunday, August 22. There were three options up for vote. Option #2 received the most votes.

OPTION #2 \$157,139

Restore all stained-glass windows that we presently have and use eight (8) restored windows from the Nursery/Library to be installed at the sides of the altar. Those eight (8) windows in the Nursery/Library will then be replaced with plain glass only. The remaining fifteen (15) windows in the Nursery/Library would be restored stained glass. There are a total of 23 windows in the Nursery/Library.

Thank you to Mel Molzer and Steve Olson for all their work meeting with the company and working out the details for restoring our stained glass windows. We will keep the congregation informed of the progress.
