NEWS UPDATE: Jesus is still Lord!

When there is serious illness or an illness scare in the family - **Jesus is still Lord!**

When our efforts to 'live stream' our worship services and upgrade our web page continue to run into difficulty - **Jesus is still Lord!**

Jesus is still Lord! Do our words and actions reflect this?

Or, are we living in fear? If so, we need to ask ourselves what we are afraid of and wonder how this reflects on the fact, **Jesus is still Lord!**

In our decisions going forward, decisions about church attendance, involvement in ministry, time in personal and family devotion..... we need to think about how what we each decide and do will reflect that **Jesus is still Lord!**

In our dealings and decisions concerning the threat of Covid-19, I am not certain that we have always been wise and reflective of our assurance and knowledge that **Jesus is still Lord!**

I know that I have struggled with this in decisions over the past several months about certain pastoral home visits, visiting my own family, whether to get the Covid-19 vaccine (I just received my 2nd Pfizer shot on March 29th),

I sent out a note as follows:

A neighboring pastor learned that many were not coming to church because they 'didn't trust' their fellow members to practice safe guidelines in dealing with the threat of disease. I don't know if this is part of what is happening here at Holy Cross, all I know is that I am convinced that our worship attendance and involvement in ministry is NOT where God wants it to be.

I am working on some things. I shared some of the things being considered in last month's newsletter. I have been pleased to see the confirmation students and their families returning to worship and the decent attendance we had at our Thursday Night Lenten Services. Attendance is also again growing at our Saturday night service, but much still needs to be done.

Do you think that we are doing all of what God wants us to be doing here at Holy Cross? If not, then I encourage you to do something about it. If there is something that is keeping you away from worship, then help us address it!

Regarding trust: We have to be able to trust one another. That doesn't mean that each will do exactly what YOU think THEY should, but we must trust the heart and intention of our fellow members in such matters. If we don't, then I think the demons will have a wedge that they will continue to drive between us. It would result in keeping many away from the worship of God, fellowship, and the receiving of the Lord's Sacraments for months and years to come. And dear friends, that would be devastating to so many souls!

Before and after worship services I have seen and observed some wonderful interactions and conversations. We have had several guests! I think God is planning to see Holy Cross again be filled for worship as we go forward. If you are able to attend, will you not be part of the experience? I hope and pray you will be!

I urge you to trust one another to be wise about how they handle the threats of various serious diseases. This is what we have always done in the past – why can't we continue to do that now?

And, regardless of how wise or trustworthy we think others may be, will we not trust in our Lord and Savior? **Jesus is still Lord!**

Remember, as fellow believers, we are all in this together and God continues to do His thing among us and through us by His grace. Your thoughts and input are always welcome, as we continually turn to our Lord in prayer asking for His guidance and strength!

When we all get a bit 'on-edge', in these difficult, confusing times, be patient with one another and practice an extra measure of grace and care with one another. Remember that we are all the children of God in Christ Jesus. Let us love and forgive one another as God, in Jesus, has first loved and forgiven us.

And, even in the midst of tears, remember the cause for rejoicing (Philippians 4:4-7) that always remains ours, in Jesus. Because,....

Jesus is still Lord!
